Dear Friends, We hear today's Gospel about "teaching these commandments" and we instinctively think of formal instruction by professional teachers, deacons and priests. But throughout the Gospel, Jesus appeals to our sense of righteousness and altruism - that God's Spirit of justice and compassion is a more creative and effective force in our lives than any self-centred cost-benefit calculation. Faith begins in the heart, Jesus says. What we say, what we do, what we decide, are all responses to the God who speaks to us in the depths of our hearts, the God in whose image and likeness we have been created. While the scribes and Pharisees were obsessed with the meticulous keeping of the letter of the Law, Jesus taught the importance of the more difficult task of embracing the Spirit of love and humility that endows all just laws with their purpose and meaning. Christ speaks not of rules and regulations but the much deeper and profound values of the human heart. "What else are the laws of God," St. Augustine said, "but the very presence of the Holy Spirit."
