### **Broken Soil**

very farmer and gardener knows that good soil is broken soil: soil that is tilled and turned to break through the winter cold and hardness so that the spring rain can nourish it; soil that has cracks and ridges into which seeds can take root in the rich nutrients of the wet, dark earth.



The mother who has experienced the death of a child now serves as an advocate and support for other moms and dads living that same nightmare. Good soil is broken soil.

The secondary school student who has been homeless, who has been the object of ridicule because of his religion or culture, who has endured the pain and indignity of racism, helps younger kids at his school cope with those same issues in their lives. Good soil is broken soil.

The retired business professional who remembers all too well the risks and nearcatastrophes of launching a company gives his time mentoring a new generation of small business owners: helping them negotiate the perils of arranging financing, managing a work force, and effectively marketing their products and services. Good soil is broken soil.

As happens, their paths crossed. Her grace and kindness transformed his often-cynical outlook into an optimism that uncovered his own generosity and openness of heart; his "we can fix this" attitude lifted her out of the sadness and fear rooted in her difficult childhood and family life. Theirs is a love story of broken soil that is good soil.

Each of us, in our own way, is broken soil, ploughed and turned over in all kinds of ways. We see our brokenness as something that diminishes us, that we try to hide, that somehow makes us unlovable or incapable of loving. But, if we embrace the faith and trust of the Gospel sower, our brokenness becomes the very means through which the seed of God's love takes root and grows and is harvested in the midst of family, friends, community and church. In Christ, no one is "bad soil" - whatever has broken us can be the means to realizing the harvest of the resurrection. We are called to follow Jesus and his example of loving others regardless of the hardness or barrenness of their "soil," trusting in the power of God's Word and Holy Spirit to reap the life of his compassion and peace in everyone's "ground."




### A Big Thank You
